Some paths are easy, some make you sweat, but all of them lead to views that will leave your jaw dropping.

Wildlife here is just as breathtaking. Monkeys leap between

trees, colorful birds flash past, and rare plants hide in the

forest. These mountains are like Kaohsiung's treasure chest and beating heart, providing clean air and fresh water for the city below. Without them, the bustling harbor would not shine so brightly.
